In 2013, the Twelfth Street Heritage Re-Entry Program was recognized in an article titled Prison-to-Workforce Pipeline in the Seventh Day Adventist Outlook magazine and in March 2015 was recognized as a *Ford Freedom Unsung Hero* Honoree.

In 2010, Dwayne, added a Youth Mentoring program to the expanding role of Twelfth Street Heritage Development Corporation. To date, this program has mentored thousands of youths in the urban core – about 1,500 youth/year. This in turn, has resulted in Mr. Williams being sought after all over the country to participate in and provide youth mentoring workshops.

Throughout Mr. Williams career he has received several special recognitions and honors. In 1997, he received the Key to the City of Kansas City with his involvement with the Mayor's Youth Ambassadors Program and other citywide special events. He was also featured in *JET* and *Ebony* Magazines for his community and civic involvement with professional organizations throughout the State of Missouri.

Dwayne's education consists of completing the New Venture Fast Trac Program through the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation, Neighbor Works of America.
